Summary of Legislation

SB098_L.002 strikes everything below the enacting clause. It allows each county, municipality, or special district that has created a conservation trust fund to cooperate or contract with a conservation district or a local noxious weed control program. Cooperation includes the sharing of moneys for the acquisition, development, and maintenance of new conservation sites.

Local Government Impact

The amendment is assessed as having a local fiscal impact because it allows for the sharing of Conservation Trust Fund moneys with conservation districts and local noxious weed control programs that are not currently authorized to receive such moneys. This will result in less money being available for other functions. Conservation districts and local noxious weed control programs will utilize moneys allocated to them to develop, administer, and maintain soil conservation and noxious weed control efforts.
