TITLE: CONCERNING CLARIFICATION OF PROVISIONS AUTHORIZING IGNITION INTERLOCK DEVICES.**Summary of Legislation**

This bill repeals and reenacts the statutes governing the use of ignition interlock devices (IID) for motor vehicles. The bill was signed into law by the Governor on June 8, 2012, and took effect August 8, 2012.

Background

An IID is a mechanism installed on a motor vehicle's dashboard that measures Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC). Before the vehicle's motor can be started, the driver first must exhale into the device; if the resultant BAC is greater than a certain level, the device prevents the engine from being started.

State Revenue and Expenditures

This bill reorganizes and slightly alters statutes, which is expected to neither increase or decrease the workload of the courts. It is, therefore, assessed as having no fiscal impact.
