Summary of Legislation

No later than July 1, 2013, this bill requires that all institutions of higher education develop, maintain, and make publicly available a searchable, online revenue and expenditure database. The bill also applies to private institutions of higher education that take part in the College Opportunity Fund program. The bill requires that the institutions include the same information related to revenue and expenditures that is currently required of the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT).

In addition to that information, the bill requires that the institutions also supply current fiscal year information for each professor at the institution that includes: annual salary, total contributions paid as benefits, expense reimbursements, and any other payment made by the institution of higher education to the professor. The database must also contain information on the number of classes the professor has taught and the amount of grant moneys the professor received. The database must be searchable and updated at least every 5 business days to include new transactions.

Background

This bill requires that the institutions include the same information currently required of CDOT, pursuant to House Bill 11-1002, which required that the CDOT develop and maintain a publicly accessible, searchable, online database of its revenue and expenditure data. That database is required to link to the state's existing Transparency Online Project website, and meet the following requirements:

- revenue transaction detail must include the amount received, date received, source of revenue, reason for payment, account credited, and program for which moneys were received;
- expenditure transaction detail must include the amount expended, date expended, vendor that received the payment, purchase category, and fund from which the expenditure was made; and
- detail on payments made to employees is limited to the employee's personnel area, job title, and gross year-to-date payments.

State Expenditures

This bill will increase costs for institutions of higher education by \$2,750,000 in FY 2012-13 and \$1,210,000 in FY 2013-14. Each institution of higher education will have increased costs to create the searchable, online revenue and expenditure database, and to include additional detail for teaching staff, compensation, benefits, and reimbursements. Costs include hardware and software, licensing, and data testing, in order to implement the database by July 2013. The estimates for up-front cost range from \$155,000 to \$499,000 per institution.

Additionally, institutions will have ongoing maintenance costs, since the database must be updated every 5 business days, and much of the transaction detail must be input manually. Estimates for ongoing staff cost beginning in FY 2013-14 range from \$55,000 to \$307,000 annually.

In the absence of more detailed information concerning these variances, this fiscal note uses the lowest cost estimate \$250,000 for each research institution of higher education (4 schools), \$155,000 for each four-year college (5 schools), and \$75,000 for each college in the community college system (13 schools) in FY 2012-13, for one-time implementation costs. Each school will then require an additional \$55,000 annually beginning in FY 2013-14, to pay for ongoing updates and maintenance. As additional information and specifications become available, actual appropriations may require adjustment during the annual budget setting process.

State Appropriations

In FY 2012-13, this bill requires General Fund appropriations as follows:

- \$250,000 to the Board of Governors of the Colorado State University System;
- \$250,000 to the Board of Regents of the University of Colorado;

- \$250,000 to the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines;
- \$250,000 to the Board of Trustees of the University of Northern Colorado
- \$155,000 to the Trustees of Adams State College;
- \$155,000 to the Trustees of Colorado Mesa University
- \$155,000 to the Trustees of Metropolitan State College of Denver;
- \$155,000 to the Trustees of Western State College;
- \$155,000 to the Trustees of Fort Lewis College; and
- \$975,000 to the State Board for Community Colleges and Occupational Education.
