Summary of Legislation

The bill requires dog breeders to provide dogs that are kept in the breeders' facilities with access to sanitary, ventilated, solid flooring in their cages.

Background

Under the Pet Animal Care Facilities Program (PACFA), the Colorado Department of Agriculture has the authority to license and inspect all pet animal care facilities. Inspections are conducted when the facility opens and then every six to 24 months thereafter, according to risk classification assessed by the department, or if a complaint is filed.

State Expenditures

The bill will not significantly affect state expenditures. It requires dog breeding facilities to be inspected for the solid flooring in dog cages, as well as updated inspection documents, but these requirements can be accomplished in the normal course of inspection and within existing resources.
