Effective Date: The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 4, 2013, and takes effect on January 1, 2014.

Summary of Legislation

This bill allows the Department of Public Health and Environment (DPHE) to promulgate rules to establish an alternative method for heavy-duty diesel vehicles to demonstrate compliance with emissions opacity standards. Owners of these vehicles currently self-certify that they are in compliance, which does not change under this bill. The promulgated rules must contain eligibility requirements for enrollment of these vehicles in the alternative method, including when the vehicles must be discontinued from enrollment.

State Expenditures

This bill may increase state expenditures by a minimal amount. Rulemaking under this bill is optional, and if the DPHE decides to establish an alternate testing method, new workload is expected to be minimal, and accomplished within existing appropriations to DPHE.
