The bill would have allowed a county to establish wildfire mitigation standard compliance programs for the sale of homes. It would have increased local expenditures on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation was required.

Fiscal Note Status: The final fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill. The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Local Government and Housing Committee on April 30, 2024; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

The bill allows a board of county commissioners in affected counties to establish a program requiring wildfire mitigation of an existing residence or structure in order to be eligible for a residential building permit or certificate of occupancy. The program requirements must be in line with wildfire safety and mitigation standards established by the Insurance Institute for Business and Home Safety, the Colorado State Forest Service, or any standard adopted by a county.

Affected counties include Archuleta, Boulder, Chaffee, Clear Creek, Douglas, Eagle, El Paso, Gilpin, Gunnison, Jefferson, Ouray, Summit, and any county that adopts wildfire mitigation requirements when issuing a permit or certificate of occupancy. Affected counties must post on a public website a list of individuals or entities that perform wildfire mitigation services.

Local Government

Affected counties will incur increased expenditures to collect and share the required information.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
