Summary Information

Overview. The bill allows local governments to impose installation or operational requirements for an electronic fence detection system.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

For electronic fence detection systems, the bill permits local governments to:

- impose installation or operational requirements within the local government's adopted permitting process for alarm systems;
- require a permit, as long as it is not in addition to permits for other alarm systems;
- inspect the system during its standard alarm system inspections; and
- apply different or stricter requirements for these systems in residential areas or prohibit their installation or operation entirely.

Local Government

To the extent local governments choose to impose requirements, permits, and/or inspections, revenue, expenditure, and/or workload may increase. The exact impact will depend on the regulations adopted by the local jurisdiction.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 30, 2025, and takes effect on August 6, 2025, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
